Thanksgiving Baskets We Need Your Help

Congregation Shir Shalom, Temple Beth Zion, and North Presbyterian Church will be assembling Thanksgiving Baskets for needy families in Buffalo in just a few weeks. This year, assembly of Thanksgiving Baskets will be done at North Presbyterian Church on N. Forest Road in Amherst, on Saturday, November 21st at 9:00am, with distribution on Sunday, November 22nd (time yet to be determined.)

With your help, we prepare over 500 baskets of food, annually, for agencies that feed local families. We hope to do the same this year. The increase in the price of food and other items makes it difficult for all of us, especially for those around us who are less fortunate. Please consider donating non-perishable foods, including stuffing mix, canned vegetables or fruit, cranberry sauce, raw potatoes, brownie mix, a frozen turkey, a boxed dinner of these items for a family of four, or a monetary donation. Wegmans and Tops heavily discount turkey prices in November, so please consider buying an extra one to donate, which will decrease the number of turkeys we must buy at nearfull price. To run this program it typically costs us about \$5,000 in food. A donation of even one food item makes a difference.

All food will be delivered to agencies on Sunday morning, November 22nd. Non-perishable foods can be dropped off at the Temple office anytime earlier. Frozen turkeys may be stored at Temple, if freezer space is available. Please notify me if you intend to drop off a dinner or turkey. If you need additional information, or if you would like to volunteer to help, please contact me. Share the joy of Thanksgiving with those in our community who are hungry and need our help.

From the Desk of Rabbi Alex Lazarus-Klein



I love the sound of the Hebrew word Shalom. There is comfort in just saying it out loud. What stands out is that final syllable the "om," a syllable that connects in my mind to the English word home. To be at peace is to be at home. We feel safe, comfortable, able to be ourselves.

If war is about conflict, peace is about cooperation, working with "the other" making things right, even when things are difficult. It is a long-term project, requiring hard work and lots of perseverance. And, it

begins with the relationships we have with one another, which must be strong enough to withstand disagreement and dissension.

Several years ago, I was approached by a local clergy member about a particularly thorny situation that impacted his congregation as well as our own. We had never met, and when we sat down in my former office in the music room it was summer and it was very hot. We both knew from the beginning that this would not be an easy conversation. And, indeed it was not and we did not leave in agreement with one another's position. Still, what emerged was a friendship not only between the two of us, but between our two communities.

The pastor in question is William Hennessy, and the community, North Presbyterian Church on North Forest Road. He is now a good friend of mine and we have coordinated on many projects these past three years, most recently in conjunction with Temple Beth Zion and Westminster Presbyterian to combat the friction between the Presbyterian USA and the American Jewish community over the Israel/Palestine issue.

This year, we will have our third pulpit exchange always on the weekend immediately preceding Thanksgiving (November 20-22), this year's topic being "what makes your religious tradition special." He will join us that Friday night, and I will head over to North Presbyterian on Sunday morning at 10:30am. We also will work together that weekend in collecting food for Thanksgiving baskets to be brought around to those in need. I hope you will join us as we continue to strengthen the bonds of friendship and peace between our two congregations.

November always conjures up images of turkeys, delicious spreads of food, football, fall colors, and people saying they are thankful.

Developing an attitude of gratitude is one of the easiest ways to improve mental and physical health. Gratitude enhances empathy and reduces aggression. Numerous studies have linked gratefulness with health benefits. It has been proven that grateful people are more likely to have stronger immune systems, have improved mental alertness, take better care of themselves and feel more optimistic. Most of us are grateful for the major things in life - health, food, shelter. So why aren't we all more grateful in our everyday lives with friends, family and colleagues?

Here are a few suggestions for teaching children (and reminding ourselves) to be grateful. Remember to use good manners. At the very beginning children may not attach the full significance to "please and thank you", but as time goes on they will learn the meaning behind the words. Model grateful behavior. Set a good example for your children by thanking them and demonstrating your gratefulness for things around you. Teach your children the joy of giving, not just receiving. Make volunteering a family activity. Teach children about Tzedekah - as a family donate



time, food, clothes, money - whatever seems most appropriate for you. Count your blessings together. Instead of talking about what isn't going well, list all the things that are going right. Teach your children to write thank you letters when

they receive a special gift. And one of my favorites - spend a whole day (longer if you can) not complaining about anything or anyone.

LIBRARY CORNER Many people are aware of poets Sylvia Plath and Anne Sexton, but a slightly older contemporary of theirs was Maxine Kumin, who had a happier story and died in 2014 at the age of 88. *The Pawnbroker's Daughter*, published posthumously this year, gives some personal insights into the life and career of this pioneering feminist poet, who won the Pulitzer Prize in 1973 and was also the Consultant in Poetry to the Library of Congress (a position that later became that of Poet Laureate) in the early 1980s.

Although subtitled "A Memoir," this slim volume is actually a collection of five personal essays written by Kumin over the past few years, ranging from her Reform upbringing in Philadelphia, complete with Catholic school and Christmas trees; through her and her husband's long-distance courtship during WWII, while, unbeknownst to her, he was part of the Manhattan Project in Los Alamos; and ending up with stories of their New Hampshire farm. In between, she also describes how she moved from writing light verse in the 1950s (when her husband had to provide a letter certifying to her work's originality!) to more serious "witness" poetry and also the rural -themed work that caused her fellow poets to nickname her "Roberta Frost." Throughout the essays are interspersed fragments of her work that will inspire the interested reader to check it out further.



Save Money on Taxes by Donating Stock to Shir Shalom!

By donating appreciated stock to the temple you can avoid paying capital gains taxes and increase both the value of your gift and your tax deduction.

Here is an example:

A congregant has a stock that they bought for \$1,000 that is now worth \$5,000 that they want to donate. If they sold it for \$5,000, they would need to pay about \$1,000 capital gains tax on it (at a rate of 25%. It can be as high as 31.5% in New York State). That leaves them \$4,000 to donate to the temple and they get a \$4,000 tax deduction.

Or they can do this:

If the congregant donates the unsold stock. The donor pays <u>no</u> capital gains tax. The temple sells the stock and gets the full \$5,000; the donor gets a tax deduction of \$5,000. A good deal for both!


